WORKSHOP FEES INCREASE

It has become necessary to increase the fees for Art Society workshops.

With effect from January, fees will increase to £40 - or £35 if paid two weeks before. This is designed to encourage members to make up their minds early so that we can have confidence that there are enough people booked on the workshop in order to make it viable.

At the same time, numbers attending popular workshops will be capped so that tutors will have more time with students.

Fees have been held at the lower price for some time, but with demonstrators' fees rising all the time, we just can't maintain the price for ever. However, they still represent great value for money!

Treasurer Jean Bassington says, "It's important that the Society pays its way and we cannot allow one aspect of the Society's activities to subsidise another. For the same reason, we have had to increase charges slightly for all our weekly classes in the past year to keep pace with more tutors travelling greater distances and of course, we want to keep them coming back."

Having lived in France and travelled widely she now provides private tuition in French for Key Stages 2 and 3.

An enthusiastic member of the Alresford Community Choir and the Methodist Church, Wendy loves the countryside and walking, especially accompanied by her black standard Schnauzer, Oliver.

"When I came back from France I was amazed that there was so much going on in the Art Society," said Wendy "and the high standard of the monthly meetings. I really enjoy being part of the Society and am now going to watercolour classes on a Friday."

TONY RETURNS FOR PART II

Tony Hunt VPRI returns to complete his fascinating History of Watercolour Painting at our November 25th meeting.

Born in Winchester, Tony studied at the Southern College of Art and Liverpool Polytechnic. He taught first at Southampton College of Art and Southampton Institute before heading west to Salisbury College of Art, where he became Head of Fine Art & Graphics. He has exhibited around the world and at many prestigious venues in the UK and you will find his work in the Government's art collection, the Royal Navy, Vosper Thornycroft and

in the collection of the Sultan of Oman.

Tony was elected to the Royal Institute of Water Colours (RI) in 1977, becoming that august body's Vice President in 2009. He is also President of the Winchester Art Club.

The RI is one of the oldest societies of professional water-colour painters in the world. Its aims are to

promote painting in watercolours; to encourage the use and development of water-based mediums and to present the work of its best exponents in its annual exhibitions.

The beginnings of the RI can be traced back to 1807 with the formation of the New Society of Painters in Water Colours. From the start the New Society showed the work of non-members alongside that of members, a policy still followed today. The Society was started at a time when watercolour was used for serious artistic expression.

TAKING THE PLUNGE

Art Society members Zella Smith and Jeannie Pakenham decided they would have a go at exhibiting for the first time in the 2015 Open Studios.

Zella explains: "We had never done this before so it took a lot of shall we, shan't we conversations. What if no one comes, what if people think our work is rubbish, what about parking, what about insurance? Eventually we agreed to do the event and once the cheque had been sent off in January we were committed. Oh my God, we've done it now!

"We knew we didn't have enough paintings and found it extremely hard knowing that we had to create enough artwork to make an exhibition. We both went into panic mode and were convinced we couldn't paint any more.

"The Open Studio booklets arrived and it all looked very professional. Panic again and only just over a month to go! I volunteered to have Alresford's booklets delivered to my house, so it was great chatting to the other nine artists exhibiting in Alresford, when they collected their books, posters, leaflets and signs. There was lots of reassurance from those who had done it before and it was great talking to the beginners like me who were also full of trepidation. I think that being part of the Alresford group and knowing that people would probably come out for the day and lunch in town was a confidence booster.

"We only wanted to exhibit for the four days over the bank holiday, which we thought would be enough for us. There were cakes and biscuits to make, the garden to be tidied, the path to the studio to be cleared, signs to be organised, talk to neighbours about parking, collect stands (in the pouring rain), move furniture in the house and finally arrange the artwork - sort of like a mini Alresford Art Show except in my home.

"The big day arrived. We're both waiting for the hordes at 10.00am. Nothing. See, I told you it would be a mistake!! Then the flood gates opened. We were busy right through to 4 o'clock talking, tea making and (unbelievably) selling paintings prints and cards. **Continued above.**

"People arrived from as far away as Southampton, Gosport, Petersfield, Farnham and Nether Wallop. We both thought it would just be our friends who supported us, which they did and they also helped to make some wonderful cakes and biscuits so a big thank you. It was the same on the other three days.

"We opened the wine at 4.30pm on the last day and left the clearing up until the following day. I have to say it was a huge success, and worth all the hard work. People keep asking me if I will do it again and of course the answer is yes, but perhaps not next year!"
