ROBERT BICKERDIKE Robert Bickerdike has

died at the age of 96.
A stalwart of the Society for many years he served on the committee and was one of our Vice Presidents.

Born in Blackburn, Robert won a place at Cambridge. After the War he joined the RAE at Farnborough as a research scientist, setting up laboratories and conducting research into aluminium, graphite and titanium alloys.

Robert loved the Hampshire countryside which provided inspiration for his paintings, three of which were accepted by the Royal Institute of Oil Painters for exhibition at the Mall Galleries.



Robert also enjoyed gardening and writing poetry and after retirement to Itchen Abbas he began to research his family tree. He and Joan were regulars at Society meetings and always volunteered as stewards for the exhibition.

OPEN TO THE PUBLIC: Friday 24th (10-5.30), Saturday 25th (10-5) & Sunday 26th June (10-4).

CLOSING AND COLLECTION TIME: Sunday 26h June - 4pm (See rule 8).

ENTRIES TO: Sue Gardner, 5 Brackenbury Gardens, Medstead, Alton, GU34 5EA.

ENTRY FEE: As per entry form. Cheques payable to Alresford Art Society, with Entry Form.

RULES

Any work not complying with these rules will be rejected/removed.

- 1. Members may submit *TWO* works in any medium (paint, fabric, pottery, sculpture, wood carving, etc.). There will be no reserves and works do not have to be for sale. We shall expect to hang all the paintings entered. Members may also submit THREE folio works.
- Entry form to be delivered to Sue Gardner no later than midnight on Friday 3rd June 2016. PLEASE PRINT YOUR DETAILS CLEARLY as mistakes cannot be rectified later. Each entry should have a proper and unique title.
 NB. Once the entries have been sent in NO changes can be made.

IMPORTANT - PLEASE READ THESE NOTES CAREFULLY

- 3. Pictures to be framed, sealed with brown paper framing tape (and no other) or box canvas, with two screw eyes or D rings. String should not be taut and fixed 1/3rd of the way down the frame. Clipped frames will NOT be accepted for safety reasons. Unframed paintings to have mounts or be ready for framing and in a cellophane film for acceptance as folios. Canvas oils *cannot* be accepted as folios. Pictures for hanging should be not more than 36" x 24".
- 4. Exhibits to be the **original** work of the member, and must not have been exhibited in any previous AAS annual exhibition. Copies of other Artist's work, or prints of your own, will not be accepted.

 Members must take care NOT to exhibit works created in workshops or classes that have been made using reference material supplied by professional artists from their own work. Members contravening this rule will not be allowed to exhibit in future.
- 5. All exhibits to be labelled on the back with the **Title, Artist's name, Medium and Price.** Please try to keep titles as short as possible. Please make sure that the information is identical to that on the Entry Form.
- 6. Members' exhibits are covered by the Society's insurance policy.
- 7. All your exhibits MUST be delivered to the Community Centre on time, unpacked and ready for Hanging. All packaging to be taken away. Late entries will not be accepted.
- 8. Please collect AFTER closing time at 4pm on Sunday.
- 9. Reproductions of members' artwork as cards may be sold, maximum number per member 30. All cards will be sold at £2. Cards of other prices will not be accepted. Maximum recommended card size 7" x 5".
- 10. A commission of 20% will be charged on all sales, except cards, which will carry a commission of 10%.

AGM REPORT

Chairman Sue Gentry thanked the committee for their hard work and commitment and outlined some of the highlights during the year.

Painting days took place at Weir House, at Gilbert White's House and at The Old Rectory in Swarraton where our generous hosts welcomed painters with coffee on arrival and wine to go with our packed lunches on the terrace.

The high point of the year is always the annual exhibition which last year was of an exceptional standard. We sold fewer paintings than normal due to the clash with Wimbledon finals, thus the change of date in 2016. We awarded a watercolour prize at the exhibition in the memory of Rachel Thomsen which was presented by husband Andy to Ann Hart. Thanks to the bequest of Sallie Ellis' huge collection of art books we will present the People's Choice prize in Sallie's name this year. Vice President Robert Bickerdike died last year at the age of 96. A stalwart on the committee and one of our greatest supporters he was until recently still stewarding at the exhibition.

The Chairman thanked Penny Claisse, Jenny Torbett and Mary Thompson who help with classes. Also Ken Crowhurst, Jacky Snowdon, Brenda Young and Zella Smith who organise the surgery and ARC paintings. She also thanked June Evans and Jen Boardman for their support of the exhibition.

It was Jean Bassington's last AGM as Treasurer after nine years in the job and she was presented with a gift in gratitude for her hard work over the years including organising multiple classes. In her final report Jean outlined the cost of running the Society, which made a small profit of £120 during the year.

Janet Price, Wendy Fabry-Wright and Robin Bashford retired from the committee and elected at the AGM were Barbara Walker as Treasurer and Joanna Pierce. Sue Gentry was reelected as Chairman.

Changes to the Rules of the Society meant that subscriptions would increase to £15 in 2017; visitor fees would increase to £3 per meeting with immediate effect, newsletters would reduce to three issues a year and the AGM would be held in May in future.

Guest Speaker was Daphne Jefferis who gave a talk on the Patronage of the Medicis in Florence, whose vast wealth supported such artists as Donatello, Botticelli and Michelangelo.
