We have two vacancies on the committee after the retirement of Sue Gardner our Secretary and Joanna Pierce who has moved to 'the frozen north'.



RULES

Any work not complying with these rules will be rejected/removed.

- 1. Members may submit three works in any medium (paint, fabric, pottery, sculpture, wood carving, etc.)

 There will be no reserves and works do not have to be for sale. We shall expect to hang all the paintings entered.
- Entry form to be delivered to Mrs Maddie Attenborough (details above) no later than the evening of Friday 16th June 2017. PLEASE PRINT YOUR DETAILS CLEARLY as mistakes cannot be rectified later.
 Each entry should have a short, proper and unique title.

NB Once the entries have been sent in NO changes can be made.

- 3. PLEASE READ THESE NOTES CAREFULLY (there are some changes)
 - Pictures to be framed, sealed with the correct gummed paper tape or box canvas, with D rings. Screw eyes are <u>not</u> acceptable. Oil paintings <u>must</u> be dry. The string must be fixed 1/3rd of the way down the frame and loose not taut, wire must <u>not</u> be used for hanging. <u>Clipped frames will NOT be accepted for safety reasons.</u> Unframed paintings to have mounts or be ready for framing and in a cellophane film for acceptance as folios. Canvas oils **cannot** be accepted as folios. Pictures for hanging should be not more than 36" x 24".
- 4. Exhibits to be the original work of the member, and must not have been exhibited in any previous AAS annual exhibition. Copies of other Artist's work, or prints of your own will not be accepted.
- 5. All exhibits to be labelled on the back with the Title, Artist's name, Medium and Price.

Titles should be as short as possible.

Please make sure that the information is identical to that on the Entry Form.

This year a hanging label (long enough to show below the painting) with all the above information must be attached.

- 6. Members exhibit at their own risk and should take out insurance if they feel it necessary. Only individual members of the SAA are covered by insurance as long as they have notified the SAA at least 24 hours in advance giving details of their exhibits. NB: SAA does NOT cover 3D work.
- 7. All your exhibits should be entered and delivered to the Community Centre on time, unpacked and ready for hanging. All packaging is to be taken away. Late entries will not be accepted.
- 8. Please collect after prize giving on the Sunday (approx. 4.15 pm).
- 9. Reproductions of members' artwork as cards may be sold, maximum number per member is 30. All cards will be sold at £2. Cards of other prices will not be accepted. Maximum recommended card size is 7" x 5" and each card must be individually wrapped in cellophane.
- 10. A commission of 20% will be charged on all sales except cards which will carry a commission of 10%.

NORTHINGTON GRANGE SO24 9TG - Wednesday 14th June, arrive 10.30am.

Set in a landscaped park, The Grange at Northington, is the foremost example in England of Greek Revival architecture. The mansion owes its present appearance to the architect William Wilkins who, between 1809 and 1816, transformed a modest 17th century brick building into something more like an Ancient Greek temple. He added classical façades, including the striking temple front supported on eight gigantic columns. Public outcry saved The Grange from demolition in 1975 and it is now used as an opera venue.

LONG BARN SO24 9EJ - Tuesday 18th July, arrive 10.30am.

This visit has been timed to ensure that (in a good year) it is the peak season for lavender. Immerse yourself in the sights and smells of this lovely crop. AVINGTON PARK - Monday 7th August, arrive 10.30am.

In the mid C17th, Avington was owned by George Brydges, Groom of the Bedchamber to Charles II. He enlarged the house to accommodate the King and Nell Gwynne. The 3rd Duke of Chandos inherited the property and made many improvements, adding the leaded statues and fountain; redecorating and gilding the state rooms, as well as laying out the gardens and parkland, planting avenues and vistas. His only child became the Duke of Buckingham and Chandos. He inherited Avington and played host to King George IV and Mrs Fitzherbert. We will have the place to ourselves in the morning, but it will be open to the public in the afternoon. The church will also be open. *More info at www.avingtonpark.co.uk*.

Bring a picnic and drinks, the Orangery tea room will open at lunchtime.

ALTON ABBEY GU34 4AP - Tuesday 5th September, arrive 10.30am - PLEASE BE PROMPT.

The current buildings were designed by Sir Charles Nicholson, using Tintern Abbey as a model. The first monks did much of the construction using local flint, including a flint and brick Gatehouse built in 1901. The Abbey church is dedicated to Our Lady and Saint John and having observed the Rule of St Benedict from 1893, the community formally adopted it in 1981. The community now runs retreats and courses for the public in guest rooms. Bring a picnic lunch and a comfortable seat.

Coffee will be provided on arrival and a room is available for lunch if the weather is inclement.

work that reflect the amazing diversity of methods and materials employed by the group.


